On the theme of club infrastructure, it is critical that a tennis budget be adopted and approved by the PYTC executive to ensure that the tennis community has the required resources to enjoy a great season of tennis. Ultimately this would be a task best suited for the formal

tennis captain as opposed to an "acting" representative with little knowledge of the needs of the tennis community. However, in the interests of time, if there are infrastructure or program needs of a financial nature please do not hesitate to forward them to me.
